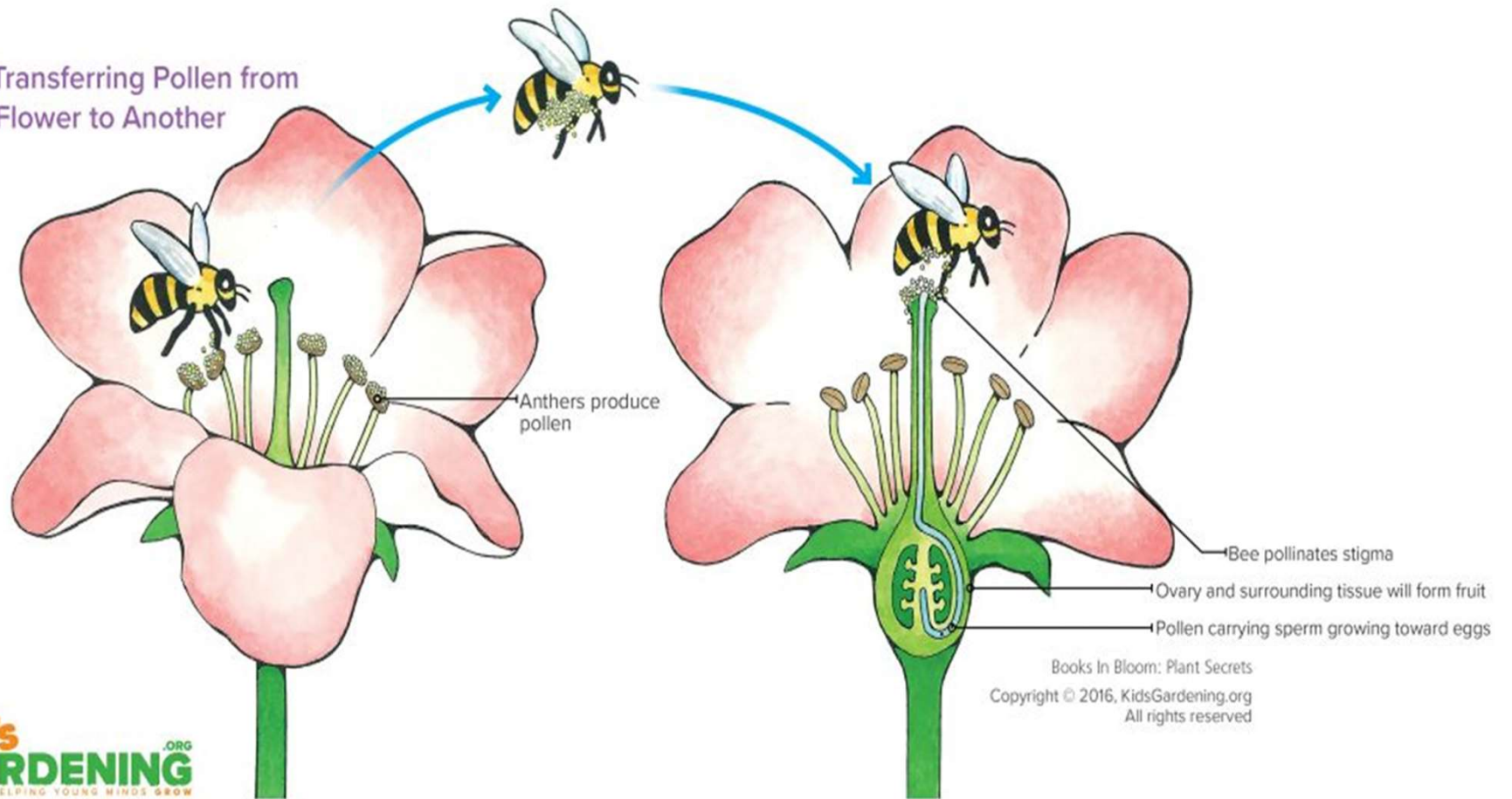

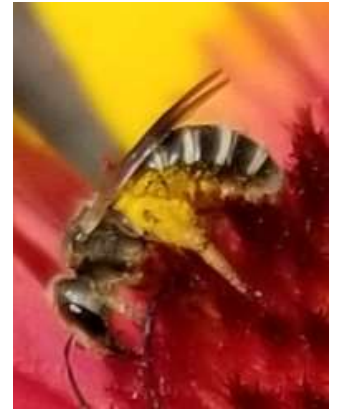


Cavity dwelling and ground dwelling native bees

- 85 Species in UC Bee Haven



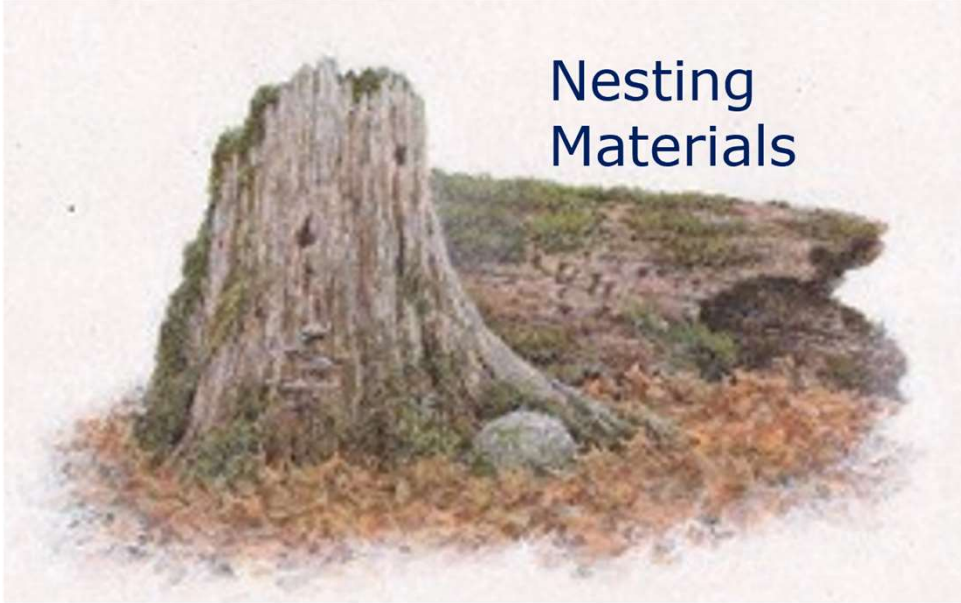
